STICS Media Collective [15 mins] 2008

The first film, made by members of STICS, was intended as an electronic letter of solidarity to the NT community Yuendumu, as well as to other NT communities.

In September 08 a national convergence was held in Alice Springs against the Intervention and in support of communities fighting it. At this convergence Yuendumu invited people out to their community for an 'Intervention Tour' and a speakout on the basketball courts. Those who attended were deeply inspired by the strength and power of this community in their fight against the Intervention.

The film chronologically archives the activities of STICS since coming back from the convergence in Alice Springs, and includes personal messages of solidarity to Yuendumu and the NT.

Canberra, can you hear us?

STICS Media Collective [20 mins] 2008

The second film details the reasons why people from the NT wish to converge on Canberra on February 1st 2009. Footage from Human Rights Day in Alice Springs and Sydney set the scene for interviews of prominent activists and community members of Alice Springs and Yuendumu. The interviews were recorded in December 08 by Karoline Morwitzer of STICS.


The Intervention: Katherine, NT. Julie Nimmo [52 mins] 2008

The final film, which was first previewed on ABC television in 2008, traces the impact of the Intervention over the duration of a year. The movie follows the experiences of communities from the region of Katherine and surrounding communities of Beswick, Barunga, Eva Valley and Binjari. It documents the initial stages of the Intervention implementation in 2007 and includes interviews with various government and business managers. One year after the initiation of the Intervention, the filmmakers pose the questions: what new evidence of sexual abuse has been uncovered? Is life better for children and their parents? What did the Intervention deliver?

All funds raised at this film night will go to buses and logistics for the Canberra Convergence on February 1st 2009.

The estimate for funds needed, based on last years convergence, means we need to raise approximately \$40,000 nationally merely to cover transport from the NT. So dig deep friends!
